A FEW WORDS ABOUT VIDEOKE

Videoke is ostensibly a solo performance.

But in the Philippines, anyone who sings videoke never sings alone. Videoke almost always involves other people. And in an archipelago of 7,641 islands, where there's a videoke machine in almost every barangay, a performer doesn't only have an audience to sing to, but a community to do videoke with.

This is how communities in Southeast Asia practice music. It's done as a collective activity: members gather together to celebrate weddings, commemorate the dead, and to herald a harvest. The survival of the community depended on it.

Like videoke. One person might hold the mic, but it's everyone altogether who makes the music.

About JUMPCUT

Established in 1999, the *Jumpcut* series has been curated or "organized" by Filipino artist and cultural worker Jun Sabayton since its inception.

For over 25 years, it has featured works by film directors, cinematographers, animators, new media artists, sound designers, conceptual artists, and painters working with new media/moving image, becoming a document of the development of the medium in the Philippines during the first quarter of this century.

The series has been held in different spaces and locales: Metro Manila, at the Big Sky Mind Gallery Café in 1999 and Green Papaya Art Projects in 2006; Darwin, Sydney in Australia in 2007; and then Roxas City, Philippines in 2023.

Since 2006, it has been part of the programming of Green Papaya Art Projects.

The program for DAAD in Berlin is its fifth iteration.


JUMPCUT 5. Videoke Philippinen features works by Philippine artists/filmmakers working in artist collectives or through artist-led initiatives and platforms, highlighting the role that alternative spaces and networks outside the mainstream have had in the development of experimental cinema, video art, multimedia installation, and new media.

The program acts as a documentation and survey of 25 years of moving image practice in the Philippines. It includes an exhibit of archival and new work from each collective, screenings, and moderated conversations regarding their history and practice. Partly, the program aims to elucidate community practice and artistic production in Philippine culture, rooting it to the Filipino concept of "bayanihan" not fully expressed by the "communal altruism" popularized and pushed by Philippine president Ferdinand Marcos in the 1970s. Instead, it calls to its older meaning denoting communal survival "forged out of a ruthless struggle with an environment where going it alone is dangerous." Also, it calls to reconsider the Filipino concept of "tambay" (literally translated in English as "hang out") from being a pejorative wasting of time to a creative action and space for the like-minded to gather and form a "subcultural and alternative communal life" against established norms.

Overall, the program presents how an independent ecosystem within Metro Manila's underground fostered emerging art practices and new forms, within communities that made their production possible, and facilitated the artists to document their own histories.

To contextualize the conditions at present for moving image practice in the Philippines, the program also includes special screening presentations: a selection of old and new 8mm films by artists as well as a curated program of works produced during the prolonged pandemic lockdown imposed by the government under Philippine president Rodrigo Duterte.
